When the final gavel fell on the last remaining cat lot on March 21st 2026 Fur Harvesters went down in history for setting all time historical price levels for Canadian East coast Bobcats and Western Cats of the USA Great Basin. Cats from eastern Canada averaged \$609.26 with a High of \$1,125 US. The Western Cats averaged \$1,557.82 with a high of \$4,100.00US. The same scenario played out on Day 2 as the final hammer fell on the sable auction.

A thank you speech was made from the stand. We want to thank first the trappers that support this place and you the buyers here today. An attendance that overshadowed any previous attendance has resulted in our shippers receiving the highest prices paid for sables in history in all of North America, shattering levels of 2013.

The buyer attendance in the auction room left little to no room for spectators. A tremendous number of buyers from mainland China and Hong Kong, as well as Korea, made the trip to North Bay. As well, buyers from Italy, Greece, Spain, Portugal, London, Finland, Denmark, Norway and North America filled our room to capacity.

At the start of the first day it was evident that our prediction of a market level reflecting that of 2013 was going to happen. We did our best in earlier forecasts to encourage trappers to go after mink and we sold out at a \$45.00 US average compared to \$12.00 in 2025. Beaver, otter and muskrats all increased and cleared at levels close to 100%. We were hoping that fisher would rally as they did in 2013, but we didn't hit those marks, but did increase well over last year.

All wild foxes increased as well, with clearances of 100%. Raccoon, which has struggled for so long, advanced well and cleared 98%, and everyone, went away needing much MORE.

The wolves and wolverine prices rose again to yet higher historical price levels. Black wolves remain the king of price as the top Black wolf sold for \$1500.00 US and averaged \$645.22.

FUR HARVESTERS AUCTION DID ITS BEST TO RELAY THE MESSAGE THAT SELLING EARLY AND OFTEN WAS NOT IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE TRAPPER. OUR POSITION WAS AND REMAINS THE SAME; OUR TEAM TRAVELS THE WORLD AND WE ARE IN CONSTANT CONTACT WITH ALL THE GLOBAL PLAYERS IN THE FUR MARKET. OUR JOB IS NOT TO BUY FUR AND SELL IT TO ONE MARKET. OUR JOB IS TO BRING ALL THE GLOBAL MARKETS HERE TO BATTLE TO GET THE FINAL HAMMER FOR YOUR FUR.

That is what we did, and as we stated in all previous reports, trappers harvesting Sables, Lynx, Lynx Cats and Mink were very well rewarded. In the end Lynx averaged \$351.86 with a high of \$560 selling at 100%, an increase of 250%. Canadian Eastern cats increased 300% over last year to \$609.26 average, with a high of \$1,125. Western Cats averaged \$784 last March and topped at \$1,550 and on this sale they AVERAGED \$1,557 and topped out at \$4,100. The Central cats averaged \$86.41 last year and topped at \$320 and now are averaging \$323.25 with a top of \$550.00.

The sable auction was UNPRECEDENTED in both buyer attendance and price levels. Before heading to Hong Kong for the HK Fur Fair we instructed our team to value the sables directly from the 2013 auction book. After spending four days in Hong Kong I felt confident that we could surpass those levels. From the very start of the sable auction till the final hammer fell, lots were banged down much higher than values, resulting in the HIGHEST EVER prices and a clearance of 100%. It is worth noting that COLOUR is VERY important as the paler colours brought the highest prices seeing levels of \$300 in even the XL size. So the sections of Alaska and NWT should receive more than the posted average.

In conclusion, I thanked the global fur trade at the closing of this auction for their tremendous support and now we thank the trappers that believe in this place and had fur on this auction. This market is very deep and all indications are a larger crowd is possible for June 2026, so ship with confidence as we will continue to bring the world here to battle for the finest in North American Wild Fur.
